

PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

This year the Megan Meier Foundation has reached **31,385** students, parents, educators and professionals through school-based and community-based bullying and cyberbullying prevention and intervention programs.*

CHANGE STARTS WITH ME LEADERSHIP WORKSHOPS

The Megan Meier Foundation has developed workshops designed to spread awareness, develop a firm knowledge base for students, and empower youth to be leaders against bullying within their own school and community. Through our Fall and Spring Workshops, which were held virtually due to Covid-19, we were able to reach 10,590 students. 91% of middle school students felt better prepared as an upstander to intervene when they witness bullying or cyberbullying after attending the workshop.

SUPPORT CENTER

Due to the prevalence and detrimental impact of the issues surrounding bullying, the Megan Meier Foundation takes an active, individualized approach to assisting individuals and families negatively impact through listening, supporting, and referring. This year the Foundation worked closely with 72 individuals for a total of 127 hours spent providing resources, information, and referrals.

SPEAKING ENGAGEMENTS & TRAININGS

By showing the devastating effects of bullying, cyberbullying and suicide through Megan's story, audiences develop greater empathetic awareness and understanding of these issues. MMF presentations reached a total **20,618** students, parents, educators and professionals, with **7,269** being through the educational video and curriculum. **84%** of students found Tina's presentation to be helpful and after hearing Megan's story, **83%** of middle and high school students felt as though they could better identify, or empathize, with other individuals impacted by bullying and cyberbullying.*

COUNSELING

The Megan Meier Foundation provides additional mental health counseling services for children impacted by bullying-related trauma. This year, the Foundation provided *individual counseling* to **59** youth and their families totaling over 560.5 clinical sessions. **100%** of children receiving therapeutic services have showed physical, social, academic, emotional or psychological improvements. After receiving counseling, children most often report being better able to communicate and engage with parents and peers, experience less depression and anxiety, gain a greater sense of hope and optimism, and experience reduced suicidal thoughts.*
