Tina Meier's life changed dramatically on October 16, 2006, when her 13 year old daughter, Megan Taylor Meier, took her own life after being cyberbullied by an adult neighbor posing as a fictitious boy on MySpace. In 2007, Tina Meier founded the Megan Meier Foundation in St. Charles, Missouri, a non-profit organization that proactively addresses issues of bullying, cyberbullying, and suicide.

Tina Meier shares her daughter's story and shows first-hand the devastating effects of bullying, cyberbullying, and suicide. Megan's story touches students, parents, and educators in a deeply profound way reminding us to think before we speak, click, or act.

PRESENTATION CONTENT

The topics discussed during Tina's presentations include Megan Taylor Meier's story, bullying, cyberbullying, digital footprints, sexting, bystanders vs. upstanders, empathy, suicide awareness, and prevention. Presentations promote help-seeking behaviors. All content is adjusted based on ageappropriateness and the specific needs of the school/organization. Pre-surveys are available and used to enhance program content to address specific needs within your community.

TYPES OF PRESENTATIONS

Tina Meier is available to speak to students, faculty, parents, and other professionals in your community. From keynote presentations at major educational conferences to student leadership sessions, our staff will work with you to customize a series of presentations that fit your specific needs. Presentations can be done in a variety of formats including:

- In-Person Live Keynote Address and Educational Presentation with Breakout Session
- Live Virtual Presentation via Preferred Video Calling Service (including Zoom or Google Meet) with Question/Answer Session
- Educational Video and Curriculum with Guided Activities and Classroom Discussions

Presentations are available for upper elementary students (grades 3-5), middle school students, high school students, college students, administrators and educators, parents and community members, and other professionals.





How long is a typical Megan Meier Foundation presentation?

- Upper Elementary presentations last approximately 45 minutes.
- Middle or high school presentations last approximately 60-75 minutes.
- Parent/Community last approximately 60-75 minutes.
- Educators and all other professionals range from 60 minutes to a full day.

*Audience members usually ask questions and seek to meet Tina Meier following the presentation.

What is a "Breakout Session"?

The purpose of the Breakout Session is to gain an understanding of the bullying-related issues within the school and actively discuss realistic prevention tactics with a diverse small group of students. Groups consist of 20-25 students from all walks of life not just the student council members or athletic teams. Schools will get feedback from different groups of students with different perspectives. The goal is to help further inform schools regarding current student concerns as well as problem-solve and further support youth.

Schools should choose students for the Breakout Sessions before the presentation. There will be no additional charge for a Breakout Session. Breakout Sessions last approximately 60-75 minutes.

Are there options for virtual presentations?

Yes. Tina Meier is available to present in real time via any preferred video calling services (i.e. Zoom, Google Meet, Skype). We also offer an education video curriculum with guiding discussions and activities.

How many students or other audience members does Tina typically present to?

Presentations can be delivered to as many or as few audience members as you would like. The most efficient and cost-effective way to present is to a large group in an assembly. Everyone needs to be able to see, hear, and sit comfortably.

Is there a cost involved?

Yes. Speaking fees vary depending on how many presentations you would like, the medium of the presentation, and the travel required. When traveling out of state, we also ask that Tina's airfare, hotel, and airport transfers be paid for.

The Megan Meier Foundation was founded by Tina Meier in 2007 after her 13-year-old daughter, Megan, tragically took her own life following an online hoax perpetrated by an adult neighbor posing as a fictitious boy on MySpace. Tina has since committed to preventing this type of tragedy by helping other students, families, schools, and communities affected by bullying-related issues.

The Megan Meier Foundation seeks to impact the nearly 13 million children bullied every year through programs aimed at understanding the issues surrounding bullying and cyberbullying, their prevalence and impact, as well as provide prevention and intervention techniques, resources, and support.





COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Since 2008, the Megan Meier Foundation has reached 585,777 students, parents, educators and other professionals through educational trainings and awareness events. In the past 8 years, the Foundation has led 24 leadership workshops in the St. Louis Metropolitan area serving more than 159,000 middle and high school students and sponsors and awarded 31 scholarships to high school seniors. The Foundation's Resource Center has provided free mental health counseling to over 216 youth and their families affected by bullying and cyberbullying-related trauma since 2016. Programs seek to increase understanding and awareness of issues surrounding bullying and cyberbullying, as well as provide necessary tools and resources to promote change through acceptance, compassion, and leadership.

Creative ways to bring Tina Meier to your community:

Team up with two or three other local schools and schedule multiple assemblies on the same day. This cuts the speaking fee by at least 50% for your school and it helps the Megan Meier Foundation reach more students who may be in need of resources.

Another good option is to **find sponsors**. Make a list of the largest businesses or organizations in your area, and then go visit the top five in person. Ask them to underwrite the program, and offer something in return (such as showing their logo at the event or letting them introduce the session). Examples: Rotary Club, Kiwanis, Lions Club, Elks, Chamber of Commerce. Remember: when they donate to the school, it's a tax write off!

Print off the brochure and present it to your local PTO group. If they can't fund it directly, they can normally steer you toward potential sponsors.

Check with school administration for funding provided by the Associated Student Body. For teacher in-service program, ask about Staff Development - Title VI funding.

Apply for other **grant monies** from your state by contacting your state Department of Human Services and State Department of Education. They can direct you to the correct office. Contact other local agencies in your county that already have grant monies from state agencies. For example, the Criminal Justice Department or Department of Public Safety might have dispersed funds into mental health agencies or programs mentoring youth.

Plan to integrate Tina's presentation into a major theme such as Anti-Bullying Week, Mental Illness Awareness Week, Character Education, etc. Depending on your theme, federal grant money may be available. Check with your school district or federal government office to find out who is dispensing these funds in your state and request an application.

Invite multiple clubs on campus to participate and help raise funds for the project. A cooperative student body effort helps students learn about the realities of the time and effort required to locate funding in the real world.

Consider a virtual presentation or purchase our educational video. If a keynote presentation is out of your budget, consider scheduling a virtual presentation and Q&A with Tina Meier.
